<u>Rector's Ramblings:</u> <u>**Doing December Differently**</u>

At the risk of sounding like Scrooge (something I'm often accused of in our household) I would like to suggest that we consider 'Doing December Differently'. The phrase comes from an article I read which encourages us to use the season of Advent (the four weeks running up to Christmas day) to re-evaluate how we 'do' Christmas and to think about how we might 'fast before we feast'. After all, Christmas in the Church calendar doesn't begin until the 25th December!

At this time of great financial challenge for many in our country, here are a few suggestions to help make this Advent a more meaningful, sustainable and possibly frugal time:-

- † Decorate your home with evergreen foliage instead of buying an expensive Christmas tree;
- † Try not to get into debt buy only what you need rather than what you *think* you ought to buy to make it a 'proper' Christmas;
- † Choose biodegradable Christmas packaging and avoid plastic as much as possible;
- † Do you have useful, good quality items you no longer need? Donate them to a charity shop or homeless shelter.

Some of these tips are from an Advent Candle resource which will be on our Church website towards the end of November.

It is good to remember that the birth of Jesus, the one whom we celebrate at Christmas, was marked by long journeys, borrowed accommodation, fleeing danger and gifts from strangers.

Hulland Ward Parish Council News Is the Local Plan The Village Christmas Tree was again well to be Trusted?

At the last Planning Committee on Tuesday, 13th September at Matlock Council Chamber, an application to build an additional 15 houses on a green field site in the Hulland Ward area was rejected for safety and other reasons. However, during the hearing, the planning executive stated that although Hulland Ward (and area) had already achieved its target of 101 houses set in the Local Plan (which was supposed to prevent further development until 2033), that fact will not prevent new developers submitting applications to build more houses in green field sites around our Village, contrary to the agreements in the Local Plan.

The Parish Council have written to the Chief Executive of Derbyshire Dales District Council for an urgent explanation of these comments made in relation to the Local Plan. The District response will be published as soon as feasible!


Medical Centre: Next 'Open Meeting'

Speed Cameras for our Village

During the past 7 months the MVAS system operated and financed by the Parish Council has recorded 1,057,693 vehicle movements through the Village. Of these, 334,548 (31.63%) drivers were exceeding 30mph, and 93,208 drivers were exceeding 35mph. The latter group would, if caught, have faced Police prosecution.

To prevent this widespread law-breaking to continue through our village, Hulland Ward Parish Council has formally requested Derbyshire Constabulary to fit Speed Cameras along the Main Road at the earliest opportunity. The evidence is available - urgent action is now required.





A remarkable £3,110.00 was raised - what a fantastic effort by the School and Village! On the same afternoon Head Teacher, Wendy Underwood, arranged for two pupils to take me on a tour of the School. What great ambassadors for the School they were.

Hulland Church of England Primary School *is* a hidden gem. From what I saw on that afternoon the children are very proud of their School and this was matched by the excellent success of the School.

Road Safety

1. Intakes Lane / Derby Road Crossroad

The dangerous crossroads at the Intakes Lane/ Derby Road junction is very much on my mind. I truly appreciate the urgent need for work to start on the modifications to improve road safety. A lack of design personnel at Derbyshire County Council (DCC) Highways Department has caused the delays to this work being started.

However, I have been told that this design work has now gone to outside design contractors. As the design work has recently started the project has now come across another unknown hazard!

There is a cast iron gas pipe running under the triangle of land to be incorporated into the new highway. This pipework will now be redirected at cost of £40,000 which has now doubled the cost of the whole project.

The good news is that I have been advised the extra monies for the project have been found. The disappointment for me is the lead-time for the gas company to come and complete the redirection of the pipe. This is another 10 to 12 weeks before this work will be started.

Rest assured that I will continue to press for this vital road safety project to be completed as soon as possible.

2. Hulland Hollow / A517 Junction

I am working through all the correspondence sent to me concerning another road safety black spot area - Hulland Hollow, and the junction off the A517 at Hulland Green which leads into Hulland Village. Thank you for all the emails sent to me sharing your experiences of this dangerous junction.

We are going to need to work hard to convince DCC Highways that they need to make vital changes to signage and take other measures to improve road safety in this location.

I understand the desperate need for these changes to improve the road layout and will strive to make them happen.
