QUEEN ELIZABETH: PLATINUM JUBILEE

The Queen's Jubilee Community Orchard Friday, 27th May

The Queen's Jubilee Community Orchard was planted by Hulland Ward Parish Council in December 2021 to commemorate her Majesty's forthcoming Platinum Jubilee. It is planned that the orchard will be officially opened by Mrs. Elizabeth Fothergill, CBE, the Lord-Lieutenant of Derbyshire on the morning of Friday, 27th May, 2022.

The fruit will be harvested and distributed to Parishioners by the Pupils of Hulland CofE Primary School. The orchard consists of a variety of eating apples including Worcester Permain, Fiesta and Norfolk Royal Russet. All the trees are labelled and it is hoped that more may be planted at a later date.

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee : Sunday, 5th June

A special Thanksgiving Service for The Queen's Platinum Jubilee will be held in Hulland Church at 10.30am on Sunday, 5th June. This will be followed by Prosecco & Pudding in the Millennium Village Hall provided in partnership with the Hulland & District Women's Institute and Hognaston & Hulland Mothers' Union. This is a Jubilee event for all of our villages.

Millennium Village Hall Update : An Appeal for Help

Readers will recall in the last issue of the Herald I wrote about the Hall's origins. The idea of having a new Village Hall came from the Parish Councillors and others who were involved with the old Institute. A good number of these volunteers helped plan the Hall and, subsequently, ran and maintained it. Most of the maintenance — apart from that requiring professional certification such as gas boilers, etc. — was carried out by these volunteers, so roof tiles were replaced, walls decorated and car park weeds sprayed, for example.

Most of these volunteers are much older now and unable to participate, and the pool from which these people came has now changed because of changing work habits, family pressures and other factors.

This means that we have very few volunteers to run the Hall and a lot of the maintenance jobs such as painting are carried out by paid workmen.

I know that the Hall is appreciated by the local villages and the regular activities are well supported. Many children's parties, weddings, family gatherings and other functions are held in the Hall every year but for this to all continue the Committee needs volunteers to help run the Hall.

We don't need somebody to commit themselves for a lot of time but to help with some tasks which may only take half an hour or so.

Since the hedges have started to come out, it is again time for the 'Hulland Ward Hedge Cutting Co-operative'.


There are currently 20 households, plus the telephone exchange in the Hedge Cutting Co-operative, stretching from Biggin View to Cedar Court.

Medical Centre - Future ?

We are all aware, and affected by, the decline in the operational standards of the Hulland and Brailsford Medical Centre over the last 2-3 years. Following a meeting at Brailsford Village Hall in early April, Hulland Ward Parish Council is organising an **Open Meeting** in the Hulland Ward Village Hall on **Monday, June 6th at 6pm**, to allow affected residents to listen to the South Dales Health Group and also 'have their say'. Housing Developments in Hulland Ward - Progress to date and the Local Plan

With the completion of Cameron Homes (33 houses) and Blue Line Homes (23 houses) there is only one major development left in the Local Plan (Hulland Ward area) - the proposal to construct 39 mixed properties on land off Wheeldon Way, approved by Derbyshire Dales Planning Committee 10th September, 2020 and due to commence Spring /Summer this year (19/00159/REM)

All the above developments, plus permitted 'fill-ins', add up to just over 100 houses - which is the number shown in the Local Plan (Hulland Ward area) and scheduled to last until 2035.

Therefore, in theory, there should be no further significant proposals for developments in the Hulland Ward area for the next 13 years !

However, this is dependent upon the Derbyshire Dales Local Plan being met **as a whole**, and this still remains to be clarified.

We will continue to keep you posted as information becomes available.

Thirty-two emails were received and co-ordinated by Tim Sadler. Gary has put all these replies into a Zip file and is in the process of sending them to Sarah Dines who has promised to do all she can to improve the safety in this area.

Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

OFFICIAL EVENTS PROGRAMME

On 6th February this year Her Majesty The Queen became the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, marking 70 years of service to the people of the United Kingdom, the Realms and Commonwealth. To celebrate this unprecedented anniversary, events and initiatives will take place throughout the year, culminating in a four day UK bank holiday weekend from Thursday, 2nd to Sunday, 5th June.

The Official Programme begins on Thursday, 2nd June with The Queen's Birthday Parade (Trooping the Colour) when over 1,400 parading soldiers, 200 horses and 400 musicians will come together. The Parade will close with the traditional RAF fly-past, watched by The Queen and Royal Family from the Buckingham Palace balcony. Thereafter, four days of celebrations will include public events and community activities, as well as national moments of reflection on The Queen's 70 years of Service.

Platinum Jubilee Beacons: The UK's long tradition of celebrating Royal Jubilees, Weddings and Coronations with the lighting of beacons will continue for the Platinum Jubilee.

A beacon chain, once used as a tool for communication, has now become a symbol of unity across towns, borders, countries and continents and is often the central point of focus for any outdoor gathering or celebration. In 1897, beacons were lit to celebrate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee. In 1977, 2002 and 2012, beacons commemorated the Silver, Golden and Diamond Jubilees of The Queen, and in 2016 Her Majesty's 90th birthday. Over 1,500 beacons will be lit throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories.

Principal Beacon - to be lit on the 2nd June in a special ceremony at Buckingham Palace.

Friday, 3rd June : Service of Thanksgiving at St Paul's Cathedral.

Saturday, 4th June : The Derby at Epsom Downs. To include a special tribute to Her Majesty by a number of top Jockeys. Later a televised "Platinum Party at the Palace".

Sunday, 5th June : The Big Jubilee Lunch. People are invited to share friendship, food and fun with neighbours in a street party or picnic, tea and cake or a garden barbeque.

The Platinum Jubilee Pageant featuring the "River of Hope": Artistic performers, military personnel, key workers and volunteers will unite to tell the story of The Queen's 70 year reign in an awe-inspiring festival of creativity.


